






BWBC 2010 Presentation Day and Christmas Lunch Sunday 4th December 12 noon start

Where do you work, or where did you used to work?

I have been a rural school teacher (the head teacher of a one teacher or very small school), a primary teacher, and a music teacher and worked with some secondary students at Mount Compass Area School. I retired twice (just for good measure) once in 2003 and then worked part time until 2007 when I became fully useless educationally)

What are your interests/hobbies?

Many and varied ranging from steam trains to trams to aircraft to things scientific (although no hands on skills), to music playing and conducting and listening, beer and wine making, amateur photography (frustrated computer user)...the list goes on!!!! If you make wine and or beer, what has been your best result and worst result and why? And how long have you been making beer and /or wine?

I've been making beer for approx 40 plus years but only making full mash for two years, and winemaking for 7 years. I would like to thank Bill Ekins and Bob Morton, without whose help and guidance and encouragement, I would never have made a start on the wine side of things. I used to think only clever people could make wine. Now I know the truth! Isn't it great to be a member of a group where everyone is so incredibly clever????
